

**FIRST REPORT OF CAREX SUBANDROGYNA (CYPERACEAE)
FROM BOLIVIA**

ABSTRACT: Wheeler, G. A. & Guaglianone, E. R. 2006. First report of *Carex subandrogyna* (Cyperaceae) from Bolivia. *Hickenia* 3(60): 267-269.

Carex subandrogyna (sect. Schiedeanae) is reported for the first time from Bolivia. This species is known from Chuquisaca and Tarija departments, where it grows in Tucumán-Bolivian forest from about 2100 to 2450 m s.m. The species was first described from Argentina.

Carex subandrogyna (sección Schiedeanae), previamente descripta para Argentina, es citada por primera vez para Bolivia. Habita en el bosque Boliviano-Tucumano, en los departamentos de Chuquisaca y Tarija, entre los 2100 y los 2450 m s.m.

The genus *Carex* L. (Cyperaceae) is represented in Bolivia with an estimated 40 to 50 species. While one of us (GAW) was working on a checklist of the *Carex* from that country, many specimens of the genus were examined, some of which form the basis of this note. In this paper, *Carex subandrogyna* G. A. Wheeler & Guagl. is reported for the first time from Bolivia. Three specimens of *C. subandrogyna* have been seen from Bolivia, two of which were originally unidentified and the third incorrectly

assigned to a different genus. This species is characterized by having all spikes slightly androgynous, conspicuous inflorescence prophylls, and sheathless bracts. As just intimated, the epithet refers to the short, rather inconspicuous terminal staminate portion of each spike of the inflorescence. Plants with mature perigynia and ripe achenes have been collected in January and February. The species has been illustrated by Wheeler & Guaglianone (2003).




Fig. 1. Distribution of *Carex subandrogyna* in Argentina and Bolivia. Starred circle represents the holotype locality.

C. subandrogyna grows in Tucumán – Bolivian forest or «yungas», between 1000 to 2450 m s.m. In Argentina it is known from Salta and Jujuy provinces (Wheeler & Guaglianone, 2003). In Bolivia the species is recorded from Chuquisaca and Tarija departments, where it grows primarily in sub-humid forests dominated by *Podocarpus parlatorei* Pilg. See Fig. 1. This species has been placed in *Carex* sect. Schiedeanae Kük. (Wheeler & Guaglianone, 2003). Only a single member of this section, *C.*

muriculata F. J. Hermann, is reported from North America (excluding Mexico) and an estimated 14 species occur in northern Mexico (Reznicek, 2003). Thus far, *C. subandrogyna* is the only member of this section known from South America. It differs from previously described North American and Mexican species (Hermann, 1974; Reznicek, 2003) by having glabrous perigynia, a shorter perigynium beak, and slightly wider leaves (Wheeler & Guaglianone, 2003).

Cercado/Avilez: Pampa Redonda, 21° 30'S, 64° 50'W, 2100 m s.m., bosque de *Podocarpus*, 8-II-1988, Liberman et al. 2139 (LPB, MIN).
